THROUGH OUR GROWING GRANT INITIATIVES, Covenant Children's Ministries provides educational opportunities for at-risk children and youth, as well as funding opportunities for churches and Covenant organizations in the Central Conference and beyond to serve those in need. We are deeply committed to addressing the needs of those who are too often overlooked in our world.

The Sterner Trust Fund

The Sterner Trust Fund was created in memory of Ronald Lee Sterner, who was adopted through Covenant Children's Home in the 1950s. The trust, which is administered by Covenant Children's Ministries was established to encourage and enable other vulnerable children to pursue a post-high school education through scholarship grants.

Special consideration is given to orphaned children, as defined by the trust, and to former residents and clients of Covenant Children's Home, namely students from difficult home environments, students attending schools with Christian emphasis, and students pursuing careers in Christian service or in a helping professions. Through the Sterner Trust Fund, Covenant Children's Ministries has helped hundreds of worthy students achieve their educational goals and continues to do so today.

CCM Program Grants

Through the generosity of our partners and current donors, Covenant Children's Ministries is able to continue the legacy of the Covenant Children's Home through program grants. Currently CCM issues grants to Evangelical Covenant churches and institutions that have programs that reach out to children and youth who are at risk economically, educationally, and emotionally. We provide resources to established organizations who are committed to engage and support at-risk young people, providing them with opportunities for change and growth.

THE FORMER CAMPUS of Covenant Children's Home is now home to a growing number of ministries and programs that benefit children and families locally. Through these partnerships, Covenant Children's Ministry provides:

● SPIRITUAL CARE

In keeping with our faith-based legacy, we provide a campus chaplain to care for the residents and staff of our hosted ministries and programs.

● CARE FOR VICTIMS OF ABUSE

Freedom House reaches out to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault and their children, providing emergency shelter care, transitional living, counseling, court advocacy, and more.

● HEALTH AND WELLNESS SERVICES

The Bureau County Health and Wellness Clinic serves as the primary health care provider for uninsured or under-insured patients.

● LOW-INCOME HOUSING

The Bureau County Housing Authority provides low-income housing in a two-bedroom apartment on campus.
